Annual Report 2020-2021

Esteemed Members of the General Body and My Dear Colleague in the Board of Directors of IBCCI

On behalf of the Board of Directors, I am delighted to welcome you all to the 14th Annual General Meeting (AGM) of India Bangladesh Chamber of Commerce & Industry (IBCCI).

The Board of Directors wishes to express its appreciation and gratitude to the members of the IBCCI for their involvement and cooperation in the AGM. We feel that your attendance has provided us with a unique chance to get vital ideas and feedback to improve our IBCCI.

The report provides a brief review of the key economic performance of the business of the IBCCI, Minutes of the last AGM Report of IBCCI's line of activities for the year, Audited Accounts, glimpses of IBCCI, details of previous Directors.

To begin with, I would like to express our deep sorrow at the sad demise of some of our vital Members due to the COVID-19. We pray to the Almighty for granting their departed souls peace. We sincerely recall their meaningful and important contributions to IBCCI.

I have the pleasure to mention that with continuous support and cooperation from the honorable Board of Directors, Members, Secretariat of IBCCI, the chamber was able to facilitate trade operations even during this hard-hit pandemic time. Coronavirus overlaid on existing global challenges, is the biggest stress test that international development cooperation has ever faced worldwide.

The Chamber gave their effort so that the trade between the two countries was attempted to keep smooth in all situations. These attempts helped IBCCI to improve its services to the distinguished members as well as raise collective voices of private sectors for cultivating a good business environment addressing the challenges and concerns of the business between India and Bangladesh.

Dear Distinguished Members,

Bangladesh has attempted a few measures to overcome the negative impact of the pandemic. Due to government endeavors combined with the hard work of the people, the Bangladesh economy has been less influenced compared to other nations amid the pandemic. Despite the pandemic, agricultural production has been outstandingly good—that made a difference in guaranteeing food security.

Bangladesh also needs to address the challenge of creating jobs/employment opportunities through a competitive business environment, increased human capital and skilled labor force, efficient infrastructure, and a policy environment that attracts private investments.

Recently, the two countries have begun talks on signing a comprehensive economic partnership agreement (CEPA) to enhance trade relations. Bangladesh proposed the agreement focusing on the challenge during graduation from LDC (least developed country) status. Signing such a deal is going to add to improving connectivity, trade between Bangladesh and India will increase.

The recent upsurge of pandemic waves in India, which started in March 2021, has caused unprecedented and alarming infection and death throughout the world. India & Bangladesh has been hit by it and lost several lives.

COVID-19 situation has been getting better now with several infections coming down due to the prompt vaccination drive throughout the country, we are forwarding towards the pre-pandemic life. With this, we are hoping all the trades and other business connectivity will take a higher step and get better making both the economies more significantly developed.

For IBCCI, the most significant events of the year:

With the increase of pandemic COVID-19, we have all needed to quickly transmission to online, virtual, and remote instruction. It can be recalled that we have arranged several webinars amid severe COVID-19 situation "India Bangladesh virtual Trade fair on Agri and Meat Products on 7th July 2021," "India Bangladesh Partnership- Economic Revival in a post-Covid world on 11th August 2021," "FoodTech India 2021 on 24th August 2021," "Digital Conference on Doing Business with Bangladesh: Opportunities and Challenges on 29th June 2021," to discuss how bilateral cooperation can be utilized multilateral platforms and channel partners initiatives could benefit both India and Bangladesh in managing economic consequences due to COVID-19.

Bangladesh celebrated 50 years of its Independence and National Day on 26 March coinciding with the grand celebration of the birth centenary of Father of the Nation Bangabandhu Sheikh Mujibur Rahman. Keeping this in view, IBCCI brought out its first 'Member's Directory.



ACTIVITIES OF THE CHAMBER DURING THE YEAR

Board Meetings held during the period

Following meetings of the Chamber Board were held during the period:

July 02, 2020: The 76th meeting of the Chamber Board was held on the day through the Microsoft Team virtually with the President of the Chamber, Mr. Abdul Matlub Ahmad in the Chair. The meeting discussed the progress of the appointment of the Secretary General. Director Mr. Venugopal N.C Pillai proposed to appoint S M Abul Kalam Azad as Secretary General of IBCCI which was seconded by Ms. Farkhunda Zabeen Khan. And considering the severity of COVID-19 prevalence, the Board decided that from now on IBCCI staff will be given salary from online banking.

July 19, 2020: The 77th meeting of the Chamber Board was held on the day through the Microsoft Team virtually with the President of the Chamber, Mr. Abdul Matlub Ahmad in the Chair. At the outset, President welcomed the new Secretary General of IBCCI who joined on 5th July 2020. The Board formed a 7-member special committee to reform the IBCCI membership criteria and process headed by its Vice President Mr. M Shoeb Chowdhury as chairman. The Board fixed the IBCCI office timing from 10.00 am- 2.00 pm and remain open from Saturday to Thursday.

At the same time, these virtual meetings will be treated as regular Board Meetings in the light of the memorandum no:04.00.0000.831.22.003.17.31 dated 8th June 2020 issued by the Cabinet Division of the government of the People's Republic Bangladesh. The board also decided that the minimum attendance of the Board of Directors should be strictly maintained as everyone is not attending regularly.

September 27, 2020: The 78th meeting of the Chamber Board was held on the day through the Microsoft Team virtually with the President of the Chamber, Mr. Abdul Matlub Ahmad in the Chair. The Board discussed the matter of Membership dues at length and decided to give a gentle reminder through the Board of Directors.

The Board formed a 5-membered special committee headed by its Vice President Mr. M Shoeb Chowdhury as chairman to buy a commercial space or a plot for the IBCCI office. The Board approved the IBCCI new membership application proposed and prepared by the special committee. A 5 membered special committee was formed by the Board to decide on the issue as to how the money of COVID-19 relief fund to be used. At the same time, the Board decided to hold its 13th AGM on 10th December 2020.

December 07, 2020: The 79th meeting of the Chamber Board was held on the day through the Microsoft Team virtually with the President of the Chamber, Mr. Abdul Matlub Ahmad in the Chair. The Board decided to nominate director Dr. Prakash Chand Saboo as the Honorary Secretary General in place of Mr. Arup Dasgupta.

January 25, 2021: The 80th meeting of the Chamber Board was held on the day through the Microsoft Team virtually with the President of the Chamber, Mr. Abdul Matlub Ahmad in the Chair. The Board formed a 4-member special committee headed by its Vice President Mr. M Shoeb Chowdhury as chairman to publish IBCCI's Members Directory. The Board decided to hold a similar platform like FICCI's Digital Walkthrough with the help of Director Ms. Mehrun Nessa Islam since she has good experience in this particular field.

At the same time, the Board expressed their satisfaction over the distribution of Humanitarian assistance among the cold and COVID-affected people with a total cost of Tk.7, 24,320.00. The Board also decided to arrange a meeting with the newly appointed High Commissioner of India to Bangladesh H.E. Vikram K Doraiswami in the upcoming time.

February 18, 2021: The 81st meeting of the Chamber Board was held on the day through the Microsoft Team virtually with the President of the Chamber, Mr. Abdul Matlub Ahmad in the Chair. The Board decided to co-opt Mr. Srikanth Iyer, Business Head, The Himalaya Drug Co Ltd, Bangladesh in place of Director Mr. Siddhartha Roy. And for the rest two replacements (i.e. for Mr. Brajesh Kumar, Country Manager-Asian Consumer Care Pvt Ltd, and Dr. Prakash Chand Saboo, Country Head-State Bank of India) Mr. Madhu P Singh will apprise the board soon after consultation with Vice President Mr. Abhisek Das and Honorary Secretary General Dr. Prakash Chand Saboo.

April 26, 2021: The 82nd meeting of the Chamber Board was held on the day through the Microsoft Team virtually with the President of the Chamber, Mr. Abdul Matlub Ahmad in the Chair.

June 30, 2021: The 83rd meeting of the Chamber Board was held on the day through the Microsoft Team virtually with the President of the Chamber, Mr. Abdul Matlub Ahmad in the Chair. The Board discussed the matter of appointing a new signatory co-operate IBCCI bank account at length and decided that as per the constitution, the Vice President can take up this responsibility. Everyone on the Board elected Mr. Abhisek Das as the new Signatory to operate the IBCCI Bank Account.

August 26, 2021: The 84th meeting of the Chamber Board was held on the day through the Microsoft Team virtually with the President of the Chamber, Mr. Abdul Matlub Ahmad in the Chair. The Board discussed the matter of holding the IBCCI election for the term of 2021-22 & 2022-23 as the present Board of Directors will complete its 2 (two) years term on 10th December 2021. Director Mr. Mohammad Ali proposed a 4-membered Election Board and Appeal Board which was second by Honorary Joint Secretary General Mr. Md. Abdul Wahed to conduct the IBCCI Board Election for the term of 2021-22 & 2022-23. The Board requested the Secretary General to provide necessary help to the Election Board for the purpose.

The Board also decided to form a 5- membered special committee to organize a virtual seminar on Mujib Borsho headed by its Vice President Mr. M Shoeb Chowdhury as Chairman.

October 23, 2021: The 85th Board Meeting of the Chamber board was held at the Nitol-Niloy Centre's Board Room through Zoom Link plus physically with the President of the Chamber, Mr. Abdul Matlub Ahmad in the Chair. The board decided on a 6% annual salary hike for all the employees of the chamber effective from 1st July 2021. The board also decided to hold 14th AGM on 30th December 2021 maintaining health regulations relating to COVID-19.

At the same time, the board approved of IBCCI Auditor's Report submitted by Chamber's Auditor Report from the Chamber Auditors Hoda Vasi Chowdhury & Co to place in the coming AGM. Besides, the Board decided to continue the previous precedence of providing the Secretary General an additional amount of Tk.10,000.00 per month as conveyance allowance in addition to his monthly salary as given to the previous Secretary.

- ➤ Reducing the cost of logistics between the two countries His excellency highlighted that the cost of logistics between Bangladesh & Germany as well as between India & Germany is lower than what it is between our two countries which share a border
- ▶ Addressing the Information Gap & Knowledge asymmetry-to increase the cooperation between the businesses of two countries-especially in the STARTUPs & e-commerce sector. Also making Indian business realize the large potential of Bangladesh market with 170 million consumers (larger than most of the states in India or even larger than many bigger geographical markets like Central Asia some parts of Africa etc)

Other Focused topics for Seminars suggested by His excellency are –

- Automobile Policy
- IT Services
- Partnerships in Startups space and simplifying Financial transactions
- ► Food Processing-Value addition in Bangladesh before exports
- Education and Healthcare
- President also suggested inviting some important ministers for these seminars and the idea was very much liked by His Excellency.
- Director Mrs. Sangeeta Khan highlighted the challenges faced by women entrepreneurs about infrastructural facilities at immigration points of the two countries and requested the help of His Excellency in improving them. His Excellency assured to look into these aspects.
- ▶ Vice President IBCCI Mr. M Shoeb Chowdhury lauded the growth of Indian companies in the IT & Software field and requested His Excellency for some leaders in this industry to address the Bangladeshi Business people. His Excellency confirmed that this would be done and as a first step, Mr. Nandan Nilekani (Co-founder Infosys) would be coming to Bangladesh soon and this would be organized he added. Mr. Vikram K Doraiswami, Honorable High Commissioner of India to Bangladesh spoke about the legacy of Bangabandhu Sheikh Mujibur Rahman and how the two countries re-wrote the history of the subcontinent in 1971. In the wake of 50 years of independence and the centennial celebration of Bangabandhu. He urged the IBCCI Members to work in the spirit of that momentous year of 1971 wherein these two countries came together to create a better future for the people of these two nations. He mentioned that the former External Affairs Minister of India Late Smt. Sushama Swaraj described it the best-India holds its neighbors closest to its heart, and among the neighbors, Bangladesh always comes first.

Shoeb Chowdhury added that India vehemently cooperated with Bangladesh during the Liberation War of 1971. He put stress on elevating India-Bangladesh relations to newer heights. The program was also attended by former IBCCI president Mohammad Ali and IBCCI Secretary General Abul Kalam Azad among others.

IBCCI President attended the urgent Inter-Ministerial Meeting organized by the Ministry of Foreign Affairs on 31 May 2021 through Zoom meeting.

He proposed the formation of a Central Task Force headed by the appropriate authorities of the Government and comprising of the concerned stakeholders to ensure the continuity of Bangladesh-India trade in an effective and ground-based manner. Considering the overall economic interest of the country, he emphasized the transportation of goods through railways, inland, and sea routes as well as coastal shipping can be used as an alternative to importexport goods.

India Bangladesh virtual Trade fair on Agri and Meat Products (7th July 2021 on Webex organized by APEDA, BFFIA, IBCCI along with the High Commission of India)

IBCCI President Abdul Matlub Ahmad spoke on the occasion and said that this pandemic situation has shown us how critical it is to have an agricultural base in one's country and also critical for one's wellbeing. Over the year's huge amounts of food, supplies have been on trade between these two countries. And with such an increase in trade, there also have been new ways of transportation to make the trade easy for export as well as imports. During a food crisis for example when Bangladesh had some issue with rice India had helped all the way. Both countries are there to help each other.

For a pretty long time in the land port like in Benapole, there haven't been many facilities like Petrapole. There is a lack of cold storage and warehouses in Benapole borders. As well as there is a lack of speedy quarantine certificates for the railways. For which the railways have to wait over 24hours whereas it's given it should be cleared by 12hours. All the association's leaders can come together to take measures to make BSTI & ITB cooperate more and things can be released faster so people on both sides don't have to wait for long. He suggested APEDA should take points from business people from both sides and go through the problems and so it can diminish and help to grow the trade further in the future.

The First Bangladesh medical healthcare virtual expo will give a lot of opportunity to manufacturers and hospital groups of Bangladesh to interact in this virtual platform. We haven't invested enough in the healthcare that we have learned in this COVID-19 situation not only in rich countries but countries like India and Bangladesh as well. In Bangladesh the doctor per person is very low as well as the low investments is hospitals. In our hospitals, many of the types of equipment don't work even if they are there or even if it works they can't manage and at times some part of the equipment is missing and they are sitting idle.

Today we see because of lack of oxygen many people are dying. Through this meeting, we are trying to fill up the gaps and by this Bangladesh, people can invest more along with exhibitors here who could then look at the market of Bangladesh of 170-180 million people here and if you look outside Dhaka the medical treatment is very poor. A huge development scope is there that is where this is virtual expo is important you can bring to light a huge demand area of medical equipment and supplies. I feel that the scope of the result of this virtual meet is huge.

There is huge scope and other groups are looking for places to invest, if we could have an exhibition of such investors of Bangladesh with investors of India and other countries then we could go for joint manufacturing and ripping the benefits for Bangladesh market also as it will be LDC for 5-7 years we can also export to 39 countries duty-free and that's the beauty of Bangladesh. That's why people like Tata, Heroes, Emami are coming also Japanese Korean people are coming and investing here because of additional benefits. In addition to all the investment benefit tax benefits given by the government if we look into investment 30% added value is here you can stamp it and made it in Bangladesh and get this duty-free access to 39 countries. This is an opportunity given to Bangladeshi by these organizers' Bangladeshi investors, hospital owners, suppliers importers, and future investors should take this seriously and use this opportunity to take Bangladesh to a higher state.

Food Tech India 2021 was held on 24th August 2021

'Food Tech India' was being held as a Virtual Expo from August 24-27, 2021. The event showcased the Food Processing & Post Harvest Equipment from India and brought together Exhibitors and Buyers from across the SAARC region on a digital platform. B2B Meetings were arranged and the President of IBCCI Mr. Abdul Matlub Ahmad inaugurated this event digitally and gave his precise perspective on how to use this platform to increase trade between countries. In his inaugural speech, he gave thanks to the organizers for arranging such an important event. much easier not only through our goods but also through connectivity through power connectivity through the submarine cables to keep it on both sides I know COVID-19 had disturbed our growth in connectivity but as its declining, we are hopeful that this will jump up and make up for the losses that have happened in the last 2 years and we knew our great friendship and people to people contact so that we can get delegations from India to Bangladesh and cement our good relationship for further investment between the two countries.

He also added Bangladesh has issued a new notification 2021 where they have allowed only one big telecommunication system but India has two of them so their container and the shipping people have contacted me.

So I would like the committee to look into this part Bangladesh changes its policy to the Indian level or India gives some relief for the coastal shipping and has those telecommunication equipment's 2/3 points more as the coastal shipping line is in a good place but it's falling,80% of the ships are not in the work because of the new routes and this is an urgent thing I would like to place it.





1 Profile and operational activities of the Organization

1.01 Profile of the Organization

The India -Bangladesh Chamber of Commerce and Industry was incorporated under the Companies Act (# 18) 1994 vide certification of incorporation No. C- 673 on 26th December 2006, as a Company Limited by Guarantee

1.02 Address of the registered and corporate office

The registered and corporate offices of the chamber is located at Rupayan Centre(16th floor) 72 Mohakhali C.A. Dhaka -1212

1.03 Nature of business

The principal activities of the Chamber are as follows:

- a) To encourage two way trade and investment, between the two country's India and Bangladesh.
- b) To encourage co-operation between India and Bangladesh Private/Public sector Companies in third Country. Business operation and to promote friendship, understanding and closer relationship between India and Bangladesh through organizing and support of activities and cooperation on culture, education, economic, commerce, social and sports between the peoples and institutions of India and Bangladesh.
- c) To place joint recommendations to respective governments on improving the environment for mutual trade, commerce, industry fiscal and investment opportunities.
- d) To encourage and develop the establishment of India & Bangladesh Joint Ventures in specific areas of common interest.

1.04 Components of Financial Statement

- 1. The statement of Financial Position
- 2. The statement of Comprehensive Income
- 3. The statement of Receipts & Payments
- 4. Other explanatory information and significant accounting policies

2 Basis of preparation and presentation of the financial statements

2.01 Statements of compliance

The financial statements have been prepared and presented in accordance with the International Financial Reporting Standards (IFRSs), International Accounting Standards (IASs) and the Companies Act (#18)1994, other applicable laws and regulations.

2.02 Basis of measurement

The financial statements have been prepared under historical cost convention on accrual basis other than Statement of Receipts & Payments following going concern assumption under generally accepted accounting principles in Bangladesh.

2.03 Revenue recognition

Revenue recognition is made as per the provisions of IFRS-15 following 5 steps of revenue recognition as follows:

- 1. identify the contract(s) with a customer
- 2. identify the performance obligations in the contract. Performance obligations are promises in a contract to transfer to a customer goods or services that are distinct.
- 3. determine the transaction price
- 4. allocate the transaction price to each performance obligation on the basis of the relative stand-alone selling prices of each distinct good or service promised in the contract.
- 5. recognize revenue when a performance obligation is satisfied by transferring a promised good or service to a customer.



2.03.1 Recognition of Subscription and other income:

(i) Subscription & Admission Fees

Subscriptions & Admission Fees are treated as revenue and are recognized when due and invoice is raised accordingly. There are two categories of membership, such as, "Corporate membership" and "Associate Membership". Admission fee for Corporate membership as well as associate Membership fee is Tk. 20,000 and payable only once at the time of their admission. Annual subscription for the Corporate Member is Tk. 20,000 per annum and for Associate Member is Tk. 10,000 per annum. Income is recognized on accrual basis.

(ii) Unsubscribed members

Unsubscribed members (Both Corporates Member and Associate Member) are those who have not paid their annual subscriptions for consecutives two years. Their membership is cancelled for such non payment of subscriptions and removed from the members list and kept separated under the account 'Unsubscribed Members -Corporate or Associate" as the case may be.

(iii) Other Income

Other income consists of Indo-Bangla Trade Fair (IBTF), Advertisement revenue, Registration fee, Letter issued for Visa, Letter issued for Certificate of Origin, Introductory Certificates Issue, interest on FDR, Recovery from "Unsubscribed Member" and Donations received. Other Income is recognized on actual receipt basis.

2.04 Reporting period

The financial period of the organization covers one year from 01 July to 30 June and is followed consistently. This financial statements covers one year from 01 July 2020 to 30 June 2021.

2.05 Use of estimates and judgments

The preparation of financial statement in conformity with IFRSs requires management to make judgments, estimates and assumptions that affect the application of accounting policies and the judgments, estimates and assumptions that affect the application of accounting policies and the reported amount of assets, liabilities, income and expenses. Actual results may differ from these estimates. Estimates and underlying assumption are reviewed on ongoing basis. Revisions to accounting estimates are recognized in the period in which the estimate is revised and in any future periods affected. Information about significant areas of estimation, uncertainty and critical judgments in applying accounting policies that have the most significant effect on the amount recognized in the financial statements are stated in the following notes.

Note-03: Depreciation

Note-05: Receivable from Members

Note-10: Liability for expenses

2.06 Property plant and equipment

(i) Recognition and measurement

Tangible fixed assets are capitalized at cost of acquisition and subsequently stated at cost less accumulated depreciation in compliance with the benchmark treatment of IAS 16 Property, Plant and Equipment. The cost of an items of property, plant and equipment comprises its purchase price, import duties and non-refundable taxes, after deducting trade discount and rebates and any cost directly attributable to bringing the assets to the location and condition necessary for it to be capable of operating in the intended manner. Fully depreciated assets are carried in the books of one Taka.





(ii) Depreciation

Depreciation has been charged on a Reducing balance method during the year. Depreciation for addition is charged when assets are ready to use depreciation continues to be provided until such time as the written down value is reduced to Taka one. Depreciation is ceased on the date of disposal/derecognition of the asset.

The rate of depreciation are as follows:

Furniture and Fixtures	10%
Office Equipment	10%
Computer and accessories	20%

The gain or loss arising on the disposal or retirement of an asset is determined as the difference between the sale proceed and the carrying amount of the asset and is recognized in the statement of income and expenditure. No Depreciation is charged from the month of the disposal of assets.

2.07 Cash and cash equivalents

Cash and cash equivalents comprise cash in hand and cash at bank which were held and readily available for use of the Organization without any restriction.

2.08 Functional and presentational currency

These financial statements are presented in Bangladesh Taka (Taka/TK/BDT), which is also the functional currency of the Organization.

2.09 Use of office space extended to the Chamber free of cost by the Chairman of the Chamber

Financial statements do not show any office rent as the office space was extended to the Chamber by the President of the Chamber Mr. Abdul Matlub Ahmad for free use by the Chamber.

2.10 Income Tax

According to SRO-210, (2012) any Association of person or Association of business organization, tax on their income mentioned blew:

- i. Subscription fees from members are exempted
- ii. Other income generated from different sources are tax exempted
- iii. Interest income is taxable income
- iv. If the entity operates any business and generate any income which is taxable.

2.11 General:

- i. The figures appearing in this accounts have been rounded off to the nearest taka.
- ii. Previous year's figures and phrases wherever considered necessary have been rearranged to conform to current year's presentation.
