From the President's Desk

At the outset let me have the privilege of wishing all members of the Chamber and its wellwishers both home and abroad. With the lessening of the COVID-19 pandemic and with the normalization of human activities trade and business is getting momentum.

From time immemorial Bangladesh is one of India's largest trade partners in the region. Bilateral trade grew at an unprecedented 14 percent during Covid-19 from \$9.46 billion in 2019 to \$10.78 billion in 2021.

Bangladesh's stable economic development is creating new opportunities for India's northeastern states. You are well aware that India-Bangladesh relations are going through a golden phase. As Bangladesh attains "developing nation" status (from "less developed country" status), India has reiterated its commitment to deepen trade and economic ties as partners rather than as competitors. IBCCI is doing its best to promote bilateral trade and to attract more Indian investment over here.

India sent over one crore Covid-19 vaccines to Bangladesh and has extended concessional credit lines of about \$8 billion, the highest for any single country. Over 350 Indian companies are registered in Bangladesh.

In the Covid period, we have successfully conducted our IBCCI Election for the term 2021-2022 and 2022-2023, an Introductory meeting of the Board of Directors, a grand Get-Together program of IBCCI members where the Honourable Indian High Commissioner H.E. Mr. Vikram K Doraiswami was present as the chief guest. Meanwhile, we have arranged Auto Component Show in Hotel Inter Continental Dhaka in February 2022 and had attended AUTO TECHNOLOGY PARTNERSHIP SUMMIT & EXPO (PHYSICAL) was held from 23-24th March 2022 at India Expo Centre & Mart, Greater Noida, India, and the Bengal Global Trade Expo 2022 in Kolkata on April 20-24, 2022.

Kovind seeks enhanced joint efforts to promote BD-India relations

"The communications between the two countries became closer in land, air and riverine routes . . . investors of both the sides should use the facilities for increase trade and business relations," a Bangabhaban spokesman quoted Kovind as saying after the talks, followed by a state banquet. According to Bangladesh president's press secretary M Joynal Abedin, Kovind assured his counterpart of continued Indian cooperation to the ongoing business investment and different development projects in coming days, BSS reports.

Abedin said during the meeting, the two presidents particularly emphasized on joint ventures between the two countries.

Kovind said "it is definitely a testimony of very close bilateral relations" while both the countries were celebrating the 50-year of diplomatic relations.

Indian President called Hamid as a War Hero saying that Bangladesh did a tremendous success to tackle the fatal Covid-19 outbreak and "we are also proud of it".

Kovind said bilateral cooperation over the Covid-19 pandemic would help the two countries to work together to overcome the situation.

Jaishankar due today

Indian external affairs Minister Dr S Jaishankar will pay an official visit here today to handover an invitation on behalf of Prime Minister Narendra Modi to his Bangladeshi counterpart Sheikh Hasina to visit New Delhi.

The Indian foreign minister is scheduled to arrive here at Bangladesh Air Force (BAF) Bangabandhu Base in Kurmitola in the capital by an Indian Air force special flight at 2:10 pm, official sources said here.

Jaishankar is scheduled to call on Prime Minister Sheikh Hasina at Ganabhaban at 4 pm.

After that the Indian external affairs minister will

hold a meeting with his Bangladesh counterpart Dr AK Abdul Momen at Foreign Service academy at 5 pm.

Bangladesh foreign minister will also host an Iftar followed by dinner at the honor of Jaishankar at the academy.

The Indian external affairs minister is scheduled to leave

here for Bhutan at 8:30 am on Friday.

"The forthcoming visit of EAM (External Affairs Minister) to Bangladesh may be seen in the context of frequent bilateral high-level visits and exchanges particularly as both sides commemorate fifty years of the establishment of diplomatic ties," Indian external affairs ministry said in a statement today.

The last visit of EAM to Bangladesh was in March 2021.

On Tuesday, Bangladesh foreign minister said, Jaishankar might bring some good news ... "he will give us surprise".

Momen said he is happy about his Indian counterpart's visit as Bangladesh and India have been enjoying

a "sweet" relation. "We always welcome him (Jaishankar) here," he added.

During the visit, the foreign minister said, the date of seventh Bangladesh-India Joint Consultative Commission (JCC) meeting, which is scheduled to take place in New Delhi, would be fixed.

"We will discuss all our major bilateral issues," Momen added.

On Monday, in New Delhi, India's Foreign Secretary Harsh Vardhan Shringla confirmed media that Jaishankar would hand over the invitation letter of premier Modi to Bangladesh prime minister Sheikh



Hasina to visit India.

Prime Minister Sheikh Hasina last visited New Delhi from October 3 to 6 in 2019 to attend the Indian Economic Summit of the World Economic Forum (WEF).

During the visit, the Bangladesh Premier held bilateral talks with her Indian counterpart Narendra Modi.

Besides, Indian Premier Modi had visited Bangladesh from March 26-27 last year at the invitation of his Bangladesh counterpart to join the celebration of golden jubilee of Bangladesh's independence, the birth centenary of the Father of the Nation Bangabandhu Sheikh Mujibur Rahman and the 50th years of establishment of Bangladesh-India diplomatic relations.

Indian President Ram Nath Kovind paid a state visit to Bangladesh from December 15-17 last at the invitation of his Bangladesh counterpart Abdul Hamid to attend the 50th victory day celebration of Bangladesh.

IBCCI seeks extended waive time for import documentation

India Bangladesh Chamber of Commerce and Industry (IBCCI) has urged the revenue collector to include the issue of waive time for importing goods.

"At present the waive time is 30 days following the Customs Act 1969. However, the importers needs more than 30 days for completing documentations in land or sea port. We propose for extend the timeline to 45 days," read the letter signed by Abul Kamal Azad, Secretary General at IBCCI.

A waive time is a rights under the sale contract and let the time for performance of an obligation.

Leaders of India Bangladesh Chamber of Commerce and Industry (IBCCI) also discussed the tariff price for importing base oil, main raw material of lubricant during the pre-budget meeting at NBR on Wednesday.

In the budget proposal, the trade body also highlighted the challenges of lingering the lab test

report for importing food products out of selected 55 items in the mandatory list of SAARC countries.

It recommended for following the practice of Chattogram port for the product releasing at Mongla port.

"Chattogram Customs House clears the products allowing the 'Fit for Human Consumption Certificate' from exporter country. Same practice should be introduced for the Mongla land port for smoothing the customs clearance," read the letter.

IBCCI suggested for addressing the policy gap between public and private importers of base oil to sale products at plant.

"We observe that different publicly owned blending plants sale the base oil through local companies. However, the private sector importers cant do so. As a result there is created an imbalance in business practice in market," it said in the proposal letter.

The trade body leaders requested the NBR for reducing the source tax for local refineries of burnt lub oil.

At present the local refineries pay 5 percent source tax, the trade body said, which should be withdrawn for promoting clean environment.

The trade body also suggested for introducing unique HS code for the additive for supporting the local manufacturing industries of lubricant oil.

IBCCI has been working as an advocacy platform between businesses and policy makers for promoting the bilateral trade between Bangladesh and India.

BsD, India to set up 6 more Border Haats to boost trade

Six more "Border Haats" - four in Meghalaya and two in Tripura - have been approved by the Indian and Bangladesh governments to promote the local business and livelihood of the people living alongside the frontiers.

Earlier four "Border Haats", were set up along borders of the two countries - with Meghalaya and Tripura in between 2011 and 2015, officials said.

Nagaland Post reports: Senior officials of Tripura's Industries and Commerce Department said that the state government has proposed to the Union Ministry of Commerce and Industries to sanction eight more "Border Haats" along the state's border with Bangladesh to promote the trades of local and selected commodities and increase the livelihood of the people living alongside the frontiers of India and Bangladesh.

"The Union Ministry of Commerce and Industries on an average sanctioned Rs 2.50 crore against the project cost of around Rs 5.30 crore for each of the 'Border Haat'. We have to build up the necessary infrastructure including roads leading to the site of the 'Border Haat'," said an official of the Tripura's Industries and Commerce Department.

Tripura Chief Minister Biplab Kumar Deb and Bangladesh Commerce Minister TipuMunshi laid the foundation stone for Kamalpur (India) - Kurmaghat (in Moulvibazar district of Bangladesh) "Border Haat" in eastern Tripura on Thursday. Indian High Commissioner in Bangladesh, Vikram K. Doraiswami was also present on the occasion.

The official said that the Kamalpur (India) - Kurmaghat "Border Haat" would be set up at an estimated cost

of Rs 5.30 crore of which the Central government would provide around Rs 2.50 crore.

The official, on the condition of anonymity, said that the Indian and Bangladeshi government also approved to set up another "Border Haat" in Raghna (India)-Batuli (Bangladesh) along northern Tripura.

The first "Border Haat" started functioning on July 23, 2011 at Kalaichar (India)-Kurigram (Bangladesh) in the West Garo Hills of Meghalaya. Three other such border markets followed at Balat (Meghalaya, India)-Dolora (Bangladesh) in 2012, Srinagar (Tripura, India)-Chhagalnaiya (Bangladesh) and Kamnalasagar (Tripura, India)-Kasba (Bangladesh) in 2015.

These "Border Haat" in around 5,625 sq. metre areas of two countries' territories or 'no-man's land' operate once in a week on a fixed day. In the weekly market day, on an average, at least 25 vendors including women from both sides of the borders from the two countries participate at "Border Haat" and sell their various products comprising agricultural, cottage and small enterprises and domestic products.

These four "Border Haats", however, have remained closed since March 2020 as precautionary measures against the outbreak of the Covid-19 pandemic and consequent lockdown, causing immense loss to the people living bordering villages.

The Tripura and Meghalaya governments on a number of occasions have urged the central government to take up the matter with the Bangladesh government to reopen the "Border Haats" maintaining the Covid protocols as the pandemic situation has been declining.

On 16th February, 2022, a delegation of 03 members of the India-Bangladesh Chamber of Commerce (IBCCI) led by Mr. Motiar Rahman took part in a discussion program on Budget 2022-23 with the Chairman of the National Board of Revenue (NBR). Director of Lub-rref (Bangladesh) Ltd. Mr. Salauddin Yusuf was present there.

On that discussion; explain the import policy, do not further test if there is a Fit For Human Consumption Certificate issued from the exporting country, change the time limit for submission of B / E to 45 days instead of 30 days. Other issues were discussed, including permission to take the rail container to importers final destination/on chassis delivery. The chairman of the National Board of Revenue said that the aim of the government is not just to collect revenue, rather to facilitate trade.

Mr. Masud Sadiq, Member, National Board of Revenue, Dr. Neyamul Islam, First Secretary, Coordinator of



the Budget and Mr. Farid Uddin, First Secretary were present on the meeting. Mr. Motiar Rahman, Director, India-Bangladesh Chamber of Commerce and Industry expressed his gratitude to the Chairman of the National Board of Revenue for facilitating the import of goods by rail in COVID-19 Pandemic Situation and for his role in importing Oxygen Express.

The shipping route through Bangladesh to connect India's North-East with West Bengal

"Cargo and passenger ships from Assam and the northeast will be connected to Haldia via Bangladesh," India's Minister of Ports, Shipping and Waterways Sarbananda Sonowal said.

India has begun to build a new shipping route through Bangladesh to connect its North-Eastern with West Bengal regions, India's Minister of Ports, Shipping and Waterways Sarbananda Sonowal said on Saturday (8 January).

Work has begun for waterways along the Brahmaputra and Barak rivers and cargo and passenger ships from Assam and India's northeast will be connected to Haldia in West Bengal via Bangladesh, Sonowal said while speaking at the "Brahmaputra River Conclave" at the ongoing Northeast Festival, reports the Economic Times.

He said transformation through transportation is the idea behind the revamping of waterways as means of communication.

"Work has already begun to pave way for national waterways (Brahmaputra and Barak) to facilitate movement of cargo ships. Cargo and passenger ships from Assam and the northeast will be connected to Haldia via Bangladesh. The work of dredging has already begun," Sarbananda Sonowal said.

He added that coastal and maritime shipping will get a boost with opening up of the northeastern markets, adding: "We must not limit ourselves to the Brahmaputra. We must go beyond and develop waterways through other rivers like Aie, Dhansiri, Manas etc."

"All the eight states must come together and work towards the region's development," Sonowal added.

Director of Inland Waterways Authority of India (IWAI) A Selvakumar made a presentation on measures taken for revamping river networks in the country's northeast.

ACMA Successfully Organises Three Concurrent Shows


