

The India-Bangladesh Chamber of Commerce and Industry (IBCCI) accorded a reception to the newly appointed Indian High Commissioner Pranay Verma at a city hotel on Monday. The IBCCI officials greeted Pranay Verma with flowers and a memento. Some publications of IBCCI were also handed over to the Indian envoy.

IBCCI President Abdul Matlub Ahmad gave the welcome speech at the program. Abdul Matlub Ahmad pointed out the dollar crisis that Bangladesh is now facing. Dollar crisis is posing impediments to Bangladesh's exports to India as well as Bangladesh's imports from India, Abdul Matlub Ahmad said. He also talked about certain trade barriers that exist between India and Bangladesh.



Shoeb Chowdhury remarked that a new horizon between Bangladesh and India will be opened up through the arrival of Pranay Verma as the Indian High Commissioner to Bangladesh.



IBCCI Vice President Shoeb Chowdhury said that India is currently Bangladesh's fourth export destination while Poland is in the third place. Shoeb Chowdhury expressed hope that Bangladesh can export more goods to India to reduce Bangladesh's trade deficit and raise India to the third place in terms of export from Bangladesh. Shoeb Chowdhury referred to Pranay Verma as a dynamic diplomat and sought his cooperation to further expand the bilateral alliance between Bangladesh and India. Moreover, Shoeb Chowdhury asked for India's assistance to save Bangladesh from debt trap diplomacy.

Indian High Commissioner Pranay Verma thanked IBCCI for the reception. He lauded the activities of IBCCI and its officials. He laid emphasis on exploring more prospects regarding the enhancement of diplomatic and commercial bonds between India and Bangladesh. Pranay Verma recalled Bangladesh Prime Minister's last visit to India. He also talked about Indian Prime Minister Narendra Modi's "neighbours first" policy which is

expected to further drive forward the relations between the two countries. Pranay Verma also made references to visa issues and the importance of the implementation of Comprehensive Economic Partnership Agreement (CEPA) between Bangladesh and India. He also focused on green energy, tech transfer, renewable energy and some other relevant matters.

IBCCI Vice President Abhisek Das gave the vote of thanks at the program.

IBCCI delegates meet Indian envoy



Business leaders belonging to India-Bangladesh Chamber of Commerce and Industry (IBCCI) had a meeting with Indian High Commissioner to Bangladesh Pranay Verma on Sunday, Indian Deputy High Commissioner Dr. Binoy George, IBCCI President Abdul Matlub Ahmad, Vice Presidents Shoeb Chowdhury and Abhisek Das, Secretary-General S M Abul Kalam Azad, and the Directors and members of IBCCI are seen in the picture among others.

A delegation team of the India-Bangladesh Chamber of Commerce and Industry (IBCCI) had a meeting with Indian High Commissioner to Bangladesh Pranay Verma on Sunday at the High Commission of India.

The delegation was led by IBCCI President Abdul Matlub Ahmad and IBCCI Vice President Shoeb Chowdhury.



Indian High Commissioner Pranay Verma welcomed all the IBCCI delegates to the meeting.

Abdul Matlub Ahmad talked about IBCCI business delegation teams to visit India every two months. Abdul Matlub Ahmad laid emphasis on visa issues and facilitating long term business visas and expatriate visas. Moreover, Abdul Matlub Ahmad said that restrictions on entry visa through any port (land, air and river) need to be eased.



IBCCI Vice President Shoeb Chowdhury referred to the value of expanding business between Bangladesh and the northeastern Indian states. Shoeb Chowdhury focused on the importance of implementing Comprehensive Economic Partnership Agreement (CEPA) between Bangladesh and India. Materializing CEPA can bring about a trade potential of 40 billion US dollars, Shoeb Chowdhury further said. Shoeb Chowdhury also spoke on cluster connectivity through BBIN, BCIM and BIMSTEC.

The road map to CEPA and its implementation timeframe need to be specified, Shoeb Chowdhury stated. Shoeb Chowdhury placed importance on making necessary framework to launch a common currency for the South Asian countries like European Union (EU).

Legal barriers like some regulations of World Trade Organization (WTO) should be taken care of for enhancing commercial ties between India and Bangladesh, Shoeb Chowdhury commented.

State Bank of India (SBI) Country Head Amit Kumar, IBCCI General Secretary Abul Kalam Azad and IBCCI Director Mohammad Ali Deen participated in a discussion on letters of credit (LCs) in Indian Rupees. Indian Deputy High Commissioner to Bangladesh Dr. Binoy George was present in the meeting too.

Pranay Verma thanked everyone for taking part in the meeting and expressed hope that many issues can be settled down through such discussions. A cake was cut to celebrate the New Year offering best wishes to everyone present in the meeting.

Indian Visa Application Facilitation Centre opens at Jamuna Future Park

Indian Visa Application Centre (IVAC) in Bangladesh announced the inauguration of a Visa Application Facilitation Centre (VAFC) at Jamuna Future Park in Dhaka. The centre will provide an online visa application form filling-up facility.

In an event held on the auspicious occasion of the 74th Republic Day of India of 26 January, the High Commissioner of India to Dhaka Pranay Verma, inaugurated the Visa Application Facilitation Centre.

Ever since online visa applications became mandatory, there have been requests for such a Visa Application Facilitation Centre, where applicants, who do not possess a computer or an internet connection, can avail of the online visa application form filling-up facility with necessary documents and passport.

Earlier, people who were unable to fill forms online on their own had to resort to using the services of agents for generating visa application forms which cost them a large amount of money.

The form filling-up facility at VAFC will be provided for a nominal service fee of BDT 200/- per application. This will be an optional value added service provided by IVAC. This facility will be rolled out in other IVACs in Bangladesh depending on demand.

As the VAFC is located adjacent to the IVAC in JFP, visa applicants can easily generate visa applications at VAFC



and thereafter submit the completed visa applications and documents at IVAC saving both time and effort. The inauguration of the VAFC is an effort to assist digitally the segment of the population which faces challenges in filling the online form.

There are 15 Indian Visa Application Centres (IVACs) across Bangladesh managed by State Bank of India in Bangladesh since December 2005. IVAC Dhaka at Jamuna Future Park, which started its operations from July 2018, is the world's biggest Indian Visa Application Centre.

MOU signed between AACCI and IBCCI



An MOU has been signed on 27 November 2022 between the Asian-African Chamber of Commerce and Industry (AACCI), with an address of H. K. House, Gujarat Tourism Building, Ahmedabad-380009, Gujarat, India (hereinafter referred to as the "AACCI"), and India-Bangladesh Chamber of Commerce and Industry (IBCCI), with an address of Rupayan Center (16th Floor), 72, Mohakhali C.A, Dhaka-1212, Bangladesh (hereinafter referred to as the "IBCCI") (collectively referred to as the "Parties").

The signing ceremony has taken place at the Nitol-Niloy Centre, 71, Mohakhali C.A, Dhaka-1212. On behalf of the Global Secretariat of AACCI, Mr. Sudip Kumar Jha-Member-Board Advisory & Dhairman AYUSH Committee, and on behalf of the President of IBCCI Secretary General Mr. S M Abul Kalam Azad signed the MOU in the presence of the President of IBCCI Mr. Abdul Matlub Ahmad and Mr. Md Mamunur Rahman, President, AACCI (Bangladesh Chapter).

Among others Vice Presidents, Directors and Members of IBCCI and officials of AACCI were also present during the signing ceremony.

The purpose of the MoU is as follows:

- 1. That both the Chambers agreed to work jointly for the promotion and development of different kinds of events in different sectors depending upon the demands in the Bangladesh market scenario.
- 2. That both the Chambers need to develop, manage and execute a master event logistical plan and timeline,

assign/delegate tasks to volunteer teams, evaluate, analyze and report results for the event.

- 3. That both Chambers need to create, manage and reconcile event budgets, expenses and timelines. Adhere to project timelines and budget guidelines for at least two major events/trade fairs and four seminars/workshops during the period 2022-2023.
- 4. That both chambers need to oversee the implementation of the marketing campaign. Apart from that, both chambers are responsible for leading/managing the event planning team in the planning and implementation process for all aspects of the event including attending regular meetings at the Chamber as and when required.
- 5. That both the Chambers need to manage and execute event debriefing, including analyzing surveys as well as recommended improvements/changes.

CEPA can boost Bangladesh-India trade, investment: High Commissioner



Indian High Commissioner to Bangladesh Pranay Verma has said the Comprehensive Economic Partnership Agreement (CEPA) has the potential to enhance bilateral trade and investment ties by creating a new institutional framework and supply chain linkage.

Both Bangladesh and India have agreed to negotiate the CEPA. Prime Minister Sheikh Hasina and her Indian counterpart Narendra Modi directed trade officials on both sides to complete the CEPA negotiations at the earliest and in time for Bangladesh's graduation from LDC status.

Bangladesh commerce minister in India this week to discuss roadmap for CEPA negotiations



Bangladesh commerce minister Tipu Munshi will be on a two-day visit to India starting 22 December for talks aimed at deciding the negotiation roadmap for India-Bangladesh Comprehensive Economic Partnership Agreement (CEPA). During his visit, Munshi will hold meetings with Indian commerce and industry minister Piyush Goyal.

The Indian envoy interacted with prominent business leaders and chambers of Bangladesh on Monday evening. The high commissioner also highlighted the importance of better connectivity and trade infrastructure at the borders to harness the full potential of economic partnership offered by rapid economic development of both India and Bangladesh

In this context, he underscored the need to take pressure off ICP Petrapole–Benapole by improving infrastructure at other land ports, and increasing the number of ports without restrictions which would in turn incentivize investments in land ports.

The Indian envoy also spoke about the need for greater cooperation, integration and multi-modal connectivity of the sub-region including through road, railways, inland waterways, and coastal shipping.

The interactive session was attended by top business leaders and heads of business chambers of Bangladesh. A delegation from the Society of Indian Automobile Manufacturers (SIAM), which is in Dhaka for a visit, also participated in the event.

In his speech, the high commissioner highlighted the growing economic engagement between the two countries that have transformed the Bangladesh-India bilateral relationship significantly under the visionary leadership of Prime Minister Sheikh Hasina and her counterpart Narendra Modi.

He noted that bilateral trade has more than doubled in the last five years and Bangladesh's exports to India have touched almost USD 2 billion in the last financial year with India becoming the largest export destination for Bangladesh in Asia.

For the unversed, India and Bangladesh, earlier this year, had finalised a joint feasibility study for a proposed CEPA. The trade deal is significant as it will be the first of its kind agreement for Bangladesh and a large Asian country.

Notably, the India-Bangladesh joint statement was issued after Prime Minister Sheikh Hasina's India visit in September this year and meeting with Indian Prime Minister Narendra Modi had a key emphasis on signing the trade pact.

The joint statement mentioned that the two leaders "directed trade officials on both sides to start negotiations within the calendar year 2022 and to complete these at the earliest, in time for Bangladesh's final graduation from LDC status."

Apart from deciding the next steps to take forward the negotiation deals, Munshi will also hold discussion on broadening the economic and trade engagement with India and assured supplies of essential commodities including rice and wheat.



Amid the Russia-Ukraine war, prices of commodities have increased across the world and New Delhi is reaching out to neighbours with supplies. To help low-income countries fight against price rise and shortage of foodstuff, India has exported more than 1.8 million tonnes of wheat to countries in need, including Afghanistan, Myanmar, Sudan, and Yemen.

Munshi is also expected to raise the issue of anti-dumping duties on Bangladesh's jute and jute-made products. India had imposed an anti-dumping duty on Bangladesh jute in January 2017 which has been extended till 31 December this year.

CEPA and its importance for India-Bangladesh

Both India and Bangladesh are looking forward to conclude the CEPA agreement which is expected to give fillip to trade and investment between the two countries. It is also expected to help enhance trade in Eastern and North Eastern region. A planned CEPA with Bangladesh could double India's exports to its neighbouring country to over \$32 billion.

During Prime Minister Narendra Modi's visit to Dhaka in 2021, both the neighbouring countries had decided to conclude the Joint Feasibility Study related to the agreement fast.

Also during her India visit in September this year, Sheikh Hasina met PM Modi in New Delhi and the focus of her official tour was on various aspects of bilateral ties as well as strengthening of cooperation in energy, food security, connectivity among others.

The India-Bangladesh proposed CEPA has three dimensions – Trade in goods, trade in services, and investment. The key target of the proposed CEPA is to minimise the wide trade gap between Bangladesh and India as well as open up new economic opportunities including connectivity, new markets, cooperation and partnership.

It also plans to resolve the issues and challenges of anti-dumping duties and rules of origin through the perspective of multi-modal connectivity and deepening of cooperation in the context of sub-regional cooperation.

The CEPA will also incorporate a host of issues of mutual interest, including the development of railway infrastructure, port infrastructure, regional connectivity through multi-modal transportation, harmonisation of standards, and mutual recognition agreements.

CEPA will give a significant boost to two-way trade and strengthen the scope of investment as it offers new avenues and ways of cooperation.

According to reports, India exported goods worth \$16.15 billion to Bangladesh in FY22, an increase of over 66 per cent from \$9.69 billion in the year before. With this,

Bangladesh has become the fourth-largest destination for Indian exports.

Meanwhile, imports from Bangladesh surged 81 per cent to \$1.97 billion in FY22 from \$1.09 billion in FY21, making India its seventh-largest export destination.




