Dhaka resumes visa services in India

Bangladesh has resumed visa services across all its missions in India on a limited scale, signalling a positive step towards restoring normal diplomatic relations between the two countries. Officials in New Delhi confirmed that visas of all categories began being issued from Friday, with plans to expand operations in the coming week. The development follows the oath-taking of the new government on February 17 after the February 12 national polls.



Relations between Dhaka and New Delhi had deteriorated following the August 5, 2024 mass uprising that led to the ouster of the Awami League government, after which former prime minister Sheikh Hasina took shelter in India. In the months that followed, India restricted travel visas for Bangladeshis and limited certain trade activities, while Bangladesh also imposed some trade measures. Amid protests in several Indian cities, Dhaka largely suspended visa services in late December.

Recent diplomatic engagements suggest easing tensions. Indian Prime Minister Narendra Modi congratulated Bangladesh's new Prime Minister Tarique Rahman, and both sides have indicated interest in restoring normal visa operations. While Indian authorities have not yet formally announced the full resumption of tourist visas, officials say the process is gradually returning to normal. The move is expected to benefit thousands of travellers, particularly those seeking medical treatment, business opportunities, and tourism in India.

Bangladesh Oath Ceremony 2026 Highlights: Tarique Rahman takes oath



Tarique Rahman's Oath-Taking Ceremony Highlights: Tarique Rahman Takes Oath As Bangladesh's New Prime Minister

Tarique Rahman was sworn in as the new Prime Minister of Bangladesh on Tuesday, 17 February, after leading his party to a forceful victory in the crucial general elections. His party, the Bangladesh Nationalist Party (BNP), secured 209 of the 297 seats in the 13th parliamentary polls. The right-wing Jamaat-e-Islami won 68 seats. The Awami League, headed by former Prime Minister Sheikh Hasina, was barred from contesting the election.

The swearing-in ceremony for the 60-year-old BNP chairman took place at the South Plaza of the Parliament Complex rather than at Bangabhaban, the official residence of the President. President Mohammed Shahabuddin administered the oath to Mr Rahman and members of his new cabinet at 4:00 pm at the South Plaza of the Jatiya Sangsad, according to the state-run Bangladesh Sangbad Sangstha (BSS).

Earlier in the day, a statement from the Jatiya Sangsad Secretariat said the MPs will first take oath as parliamentarians and then as members of the Constitutional Reform Council. The BNP had scheduled a parliamentary party meeting at 11:30 am at the Parliament Building to elect its parliamentary leader. Salah Uddin Ahmed, a member of the BNP standing committee, said Mr Rahman would assume the premiership as leader of the majority party.

In a formal letter, Modi expressed his desire to further strengthen bilateral ties between India and Bangladesh and extended an invitation to Rahman and his family to visit India.



Lok Sabha Speaker Om Birla on Tuesday represented India at the swearing-in ceremony of Tarique Rahman in Dhaka, where he personally delivered a letter from Prime Minister Narendra Modi inviting the newly elected leader to visit India at the earliest opportunity.

In his message, Prime Minister Modi wrote:

“I extend my heartfelt congratulations to you on the victory of the BNP in the recently concluded parliamentary elections and on your assumption of office as Prime Minister of Bangladesh. I wish you every success in this important responsibility.”



He expressed confidence that Rahman's leadership would guide Bangladesh toward peace, stability, and prosperity. Modi noted that the electoral victory reflects the deep trust and confidence of the Bangladeshi people in Rahman's vision for the nation.

Highlighting the strong foundation of India–Bangladesh relations, Modi emphasized the shared history, cultural ties, and mutual aspirations for peace and prosperity between the two countries. He further stated that as two rapidly growing economies, India and Bangladesh can act as catalysts for each other's sustainable growth, collaborate on security matters, and ensure mutual prosperity.

Prime Minister Modi also invited Tarique Rahman, along with his wife Zubaida Rahman and daughter Zaima, to visit India at a mutually convenient time, assuring them of a warm welcome.

The Indian Prime Minister concluded by wishing Rahman good health and success, and by expressing hope for the continued progress and prosperity of the people of Bangladesh.



IBCCI Organizes 103rd Board Meeting

The 103rd meeting of the India-Bangladesh Chamber of Commerce and Industry (IBCCI) was held on 18 January 2026 in hybrid mode, chaired by President Mr. Md. Moshir Rahman.

The Board discussed the current India–Bangladesh trade situation, noting a 7.83% increase in imports from India and a gradual improvement in trade flows as restrictions ease. Members expressed optimism about further growth, though concerns were raised regarding banking regulations and visa approvals.

The Board decided to invite expressions of interest from members for reconstitution of 11 Standing Committees. Three new corporate Bangladeshi members were approved, covering food trading, IT services, and consultancy sectors.

For bank account operations, Mr. Md. Moshir Rahman (President), Mr. Amit Kumar Tiwari (Vice-President, Indian side), and Mr. Abdul Wasi Muhammad (Treasurer) were nominated as signatories.

In miscellaneous discussions, initiatives such as a bi-monthly e-newspaper, members' directory, honor board, courtesy calls to the Indian High Commission, and issuance of ID cards were considered.

The meeting concluded at 4:20 PM.

India-Bangladesh Chamber of Commerce and Industry 18th AGM held



Business leaders have reaffirmed their commitment to strengthening economic ties, mutual cooperation, and sustainable partnership between Bangladesh and India at the 18th Annual General Meeting (AGM) of the India-Bangladesh Chamber of Commerce and Industry (IBCCI), held in the city on Tuesday.

The AGM was presided over by M Shoeb Chowdhury, Vice-President (In Routine Presidential Charge), who emphasized the importance of enhancing bilateral trade and economic cooperation. According to the Export Promotion Bureau (EPB), India was Bangladesh's eighth-largest export destination in FY 2024–25, with exports reaching USD 1.76 billion an increase of 12.43 percent from the previous fiscal year

India's exports to Bangladesh stood at USD 11.46 billion in FY25, compared to USD 11.06 billion in FY24. The meeting reviewed and approved all statutory agenda items, including activity and financial reports, reflecting transparency and collective commitment to IBCCI's growth.

The AGM concluded on an optimistic note, with members expressing confidence that the newly elected Board of Directors (2025–2027) will further expand trade, investment, and business collaboration between the two neighboring countries.

IBCCI Elects New Office Bearers



The India-Bangladesh Chamber of Commerce and Industries (IBCCI) has elected a new 24-member executive committee for the 2025–2027 term. Moshiur Rahman of Rahman Shipping Lines has been elected president, succeeding Abdul Matlub Ahmed of Nitol Motors. Meherun Nessa Islam of CEMS Limited becomes vice-president, while Amit Kumar Tiwari of Torrecid Bangladesh Limited joins as a director.

The biennial election, held on November 27 with candidates elected unopposed, saw limited continuity due to new eligibility rules, with only one Bangladeshi and five Indian members retained from the previous committee. The chamber maintains equal representation with 12 Bangladeshi and 12 Indian members, aiming to strengthen bilateral business relations.




Photo: A Cross Section of 102nd Meeting of the IBCCI Chamber Board on 17 December 2025

The Board confirmed the minutes of the 101st Board Meeting and approved the Auditor's Report for FY 2024–2025, noting total assets of Tk. 41.54 crore and a transfer of Tk. 4.71 crore to the General Fund. The audit was conducted by ARTISAN, Chartered Accountants, in compliance with the latest DVC requirements.

The Board also approved five new IBCCI corporate memberships, strengthening representation across garments, agro-foods, technology, manufacturing, and shipping sectors.

A major decision was the formation of a Permanent Advisory Council, comprising former Presidents, Vice-Presidents, and senior office bearers, to ensure continuity and strategic guidance for IBCCI.

The Board appreciated the outstanding contribution of the Secretariat, especially during challenging periods such as COVID-19, highlighting the enrollment of over 178 new members and consistent international engagement.

The Board further approved honorarium for the Election Board members for the successful completion of the IBCCI Election (2025–2027).

The meeting concluded with expressions of gratitude to senior leaders, Board members, and supporting organizations, reaffirming IBCCI's commitment to unity, bilateral trade promotion, and the spirit of 1971.

The meeting adjourned at 3:45 PM.

India's Adani boosts electricity supply to Bangladesh despite souring diplomatic ties

India's Adani Power has increased electricity exports to Bangladesh despite strained bilateral relations and criticism from a Bangladesh government panel over pricing, according to official data. Power exports from Adani's Godda coal-fired plant rose nearly 38% year-on-year to about 2.25 billion kilowatt-hours in the three months to December, lifting India's share of Bangladesh's power mix to a record 15.6% in 2025 from 12% a year earlier.



Bangladesh has ramped up power imports to offset gas shortages and meet rising electricity demand, with Adani supplying a record 8.63 billion kWh in 2025—8.2% of total supply. Coal imports also surged 35% to a record 17.34 million tonnes last year.

Despite diplomatic tensions, electricity trade continues to expand as Bangladesh's gas-fired generation fell to a record-low 42.6% of the energy mix. Experts say Adani's power remains cheaper than oil-fired alternatives used during shortages.

Bangladesh–India Reaffirm Close Ties on India's Republic Day

Bangladesh and India reaffirmed the depth of their bilateral relationship during the 77th Republic Day of India celebrations in Dhaka, emphasising shared history, people-centred cooperation, and regional connectivity.

Bangladesh's Adviser Fouzul Kabir highlighted India's crucial role in the 1971 Liberation War and stressed dialogue-based cooperation to address challenges, while reiterating support for regional cooperation through SAARC. Indian High Commissioner Pranay Verma underscored growing energy and connectivity projects, including cross-border power and fuel links, and called for expanded collaboration in technology, sustainability, and clean energy. India also reaffirmed support for a democratic, stable, and inclusive Bangladesh.
