At the outset, the Secretary General of the Chamber invited the President of IBCCI to take the chair and to kindly start the proceedings.

The President of the Chamber, Mr. Abdul Matlub Ahmad took the Chair at 4:00 p.m. and there was a quorum, called the 16th Annual General Meeting (AGM) of the Chamber to order.

At the request of the Chair, the Chamber Secretary General read out the notice of the AGM which was circulated among all the members earlier. Then the following businesses were transacted as per the given agenda:

AGENDUM-1

To confirm the minutes of the 16th AGM- the Secretary General apprised the members present that the minutes of the 16th AGM were circulated among the general body members earlier.
The President of IBCCI proposed that if there was no objection, the minutes might be treated as read and confirmed. There was no objection against it.

Then it was proposed by Director Mr. Md. Abdul Wahed, Honorary Joint Secretary General, and seconded by Director Mr. Sumit Goswami. Thus the minutes of the 16th AGM were confirmed.

AGENDUM-2

The President of the chamber spoke briefly, highlighting the activities of the Chamber during the last financial year and to date. During this period, IBCCI delegates took part in 23 events in India and attended 5 events in Bangladesh organized by HCI, BIMSTEC, and Sun Pharma. Additionally, Indian delegates made 15 visits to IBCCI and Bangladesh. During this time, IBCCI delegates met with 5 Ministers/Secretaries and organized 5 programs, including an Eid Reunion, a Get-together, IT programs, and two Standing Committee meetings. The Chairman of the AGM invited comments from the members present on the Annual Report of the Chamber for the year ended on 30th June 2024 and till date as presented by him earlier. There was no comment from any quarter.

Thereafter, Director Al-Haj Md. Bazlur Rahman proposed the following resolution for its adoption: “That the Annual Report of the Chamber for the year ended on 30th June 2024 as presented by the Chairman of the meeting on behalf of the IBCCI board and as circulated among all the members of the Chamber earlier, be received and adopted.” IBCCI Director Mr. Mule Venkataratna Reddy seconded the resolution. It was then put to vote by the Chairman of the meeting and there was no vote against it, declared the same as passed nem con, and the resolution was thus adopted.”

AGENDUM-3

At the request of the Chair, the Secretary General briefed the AGM highlighting the Annual Accounts of the Chamber for the year ended on 30th June 2024 as audited and certified by the Chamber’s Auditor M/S Hoda Vasi Chowdhury & Co. He described the financial statement of the chamber as satisfactory.

Thereafter, Director Mr. Mohammad Ali Deen proposed the following resolution:

“That the Annual Accounts of the Chamber for the year ended on 30th June 2024 as audited and certified by the Chamber’s Auditor M/S Hoda Vasi Chowdhury & Co., and as circulated among all the members of the Chamber earlier, be received and adopted.”

Vice-President, Mr. Sanjay Basu, seconded the resolution. It was then put to vote by the Chairman of the meeting, and there being no vote against it declared the same as passed nem con, and the resolution was thus adopted.

AGENDUM-4

The Chairman informed the meeting that to date the Chamber received only one application i.e., from Artisan Chartered Accountants, for their appointment as the Chamber’s auditor for the 2024-2025 financial year at an annual fee of Tk. 60,000 (Taka Sixty Thousand) only including all charges. He then invited comments from the members present. There was no comment from any quarter.

Thereafter, Director Mr. Mohammad Ali Deen proposed the following resolution for its adoption:

“That Artisan Chartered Accountants be appointed as the Chamber’s auditor for the 2024-2025 financial year at an annual fee of Tk. 60,000 (Taka Sixty Thousand) only including all charges” Director Mr. Mule Venkataratna Reddy seconded the resolution. It was then put to vote by the Chairman of the meeting and there being no vote against it, declared the same as passed nem con. The resolution was thus adopted.

AGENDUM-5

- * The AGM expressed deep condolences over the demise of member Mr. Sulaiman S Ajanee and Election Board Member Mr. Bijoy Kumar Kejriwal.
- * Steps to be continued to get a RAZUK Commercial Plot for IBCCI. The Secretary General informed the AGM that the Vice-President, Mr. M Shoeb Chowdhury had been entrusted with the responsibility of getting a Commercial Plot from RAJUK and he is working on it.
- * The Special Committee for IBCCI Permanent Office Space will examine the feasibility of purchasing a floor, land, or both for the IBCCI permanent office.
- * Honorary Secretary General Mr. Amit Kumar drew the attention of the AGM and told that the Web Page of IBCCI needs to be more vibrant. After a discussion President told that we can now allocate BDT 1,00,000.00 (One Lakh Only) to make our IBCCI Web Page more vibrant. At this stage Honorary Joint Secretary General, Mr. Md. Abdul Wahed, told that he has a known a good Website developer. Afterwards Director Mr. Rabiul Alam, wanted to assist the Website developing process. In this connection the Secretary General informed the AGM that the Media, Communication & Branding Standing Committee, led by Vice-President Mr. M. Shoeb Chowdhury, had already instructed work on this initiative, and some preliminary tasks were completed. In this context, we engaged a Web Developer to create an interactive webpage demo for IBCCI. The demo link was shared with the members of the standing committee for their feedback on 7th July 2024, but no directions have been received so far.
- * Director Mr. Md. Julfikar Sheikh informed the AGM that, despite significant challenges over the past few months, fortunately, our member's organization remained unaffected. He also expressed interest in learning whether there had been any progress regarding visa-related issues.
- * Director, Mr. Motiar Rahman, said the transition and situation are improving gradually. We expect positive news from Electronic and Print Media that can strengthen our relationship with India.
- * IBCCI Member Ms. Nasima Jahan Bijly (Binty) mentioned that strengthening safety and security measures for the counterpart could help improve the relationship, which has been strained since August 2024.
- * Director Md. Delower Hossain stated the concerning issues relating to investment.
- * Vice-President, Mr. M Shoeb Chowdhury opined that we must restrict ourselves in commenting that hampers our business and investment climate situation. He recommended fostering a strong relationship between the Interim Government and the Indian Government to address visa challenges and trade barriers.
- * The President expressed confidence that we will soon be well-positioned to resume and grow our business, urging us to maintain an optimistic outlook for future progress.

The Manipur Global Buyers and Sellers Summit 2025 / 10–11 October 2025 / Imphal, India

The Manipur Global Buyers and Sellers Summit 2025 was held on 10–11 October 2025 at the City Convention Centre, Imphal, India, under the theme **“Bridging Business Sans Borders.”** Organized under the RAMP initiative of the Ministry of MSME, Government of India, along with MANIDCO, MCCI, and the Directorate of Trade, Commerce & Industries, the event aimed to promote cross-border trade and regional economic integration among South and Southeast Asian nations. A three-member delegation from the India-Bangladesh Chamber of Commerce and Industry (IBCCI), led by Secretary General, participated to strengthen bilateral and multilateral trade relations between India and Bangladesh.

The inaugural session was graced by the Hon’ble Governor of Manipur, Mr. Ajay Kumar Bhalla, who emphasized Manipur’s strategic role under the Act East Policy. The IBCCI delegation presented a commemorative crest to the Governor and held discussions on expanding cooperation in MSMEs, handloom, agro-processing, and eco-tourism. During the summit, IBCCI and the Manipur Chamber of Commerce & Industry (MCCI) signed an MoU to promote bilateral trade and joint ventures. The participation of IBCCI reinforced its commitment to advancing regional economic collaboration and sustainable cross-border growth.

ICC Global Business Summit 2025/ 18th to 20th September 2025/ Mumbai, India

The India-Bangladesh Chamber of Commerce and Industry (IBCCI) participated in the ICC Global Business Summit 2025, held from 18th to 20th September 2025 at the Jio World Convention Centre and Hotel Grand Hyatt, Mumbai, India, with a 13-member delegation led by Secretary General. Organized by the Indian Chamber of Commerce (ICC) in collaboration with the Ministry of External Affairs, the Summit marked ICC’s centenary celebration under the theme “One Nation, Multiple Opportunities”. The event gathered over 500 delegates from 33 countries, including global policymakers, diplomats, and business leaders. IBCCI delegates took part in sectoral sessions, B2B meetings, and bilateral discussions focused on trade, investment, technology, and sustainability. The delegation also met with the Cyprus Chamber of Commerce and Industry (CCCI) to explore cooperation in textiles, ICT, renewable energy, and maritime services, with plans to formalize ties through an MoU. IBCCI presented a commemorative crest to ICC President Mr. Abhyuday Jindal and discussed trade expansion with ICC Director General Dr. Rajeev Singh. The Deputy High Commissioner of Bangladesh to Mumbai, Ms. Farhana Ahmed Chowdhury, also attended the Summit and was warmly received by the IBCCI delegation. The Summit provided an excellent platform for enhancing India-Bangladesh economic cooperation, promoting business networking, and strengthening cross-border partnerships for shared regional growth.

4th North East Export Promotional Meet 2025/16th September 2025/ Guwahati, Assam, India

A 13-member delegation from the India-Bangladesh Chamber of Commerce & Industry (IBCCI), led by Secretary General, took part in the 4th North East Export Promotional Meet 2025, held on 16th September 2025 at Novotel, Guwahati, Assam, India. Organized by the Indian Chamber of Commerce (ICC) in collaboration with the Ministry of External Affairs, Government of India, the event aimed to strengthen regional trade and export linkages across India’s North Eastern Region (NER). It brought together participants from Bangladesh, Nepal, Bhutan, Thailand, and Laos, focusing on cooperation in key areas such as agriculture, textiles, energy, infrastructure, and services.

The IBCCI delegation actively engaged in B2B meetings, networking sessions, and trade discussions with Indian and international counterparts, underscoring the importance of improved connectivity, simplified customs procedures, and the removal of non-tariff barriers. During the Trade Export Awareness Session, the Secretary General highlighted Bangladesh's export strengths and the significance of fostering sustainable and mutually beneficial trade ties with India's Northeast. IBCCI's active involvement further solidified its role as a vital facilitator of cross-border commerce, investment, and regional economic integration.

SGCCI Yarn Expo 2025 / 1st to 3rd August 2025 / Surat, Gujarat, India

The India-Bangladesh Chamber of Commerce and Industry (IBCCI) delegation, led by its Secretary General, participated in the SGCCI Yarn Expo 2025, held from 1st to 3rd August 2025 at the Surat International Exhibition and Convention Centre, Gujarat, India. Despite travel and visa challenges, four delegates represented IBCCI and were warmly received by SGCCI officials. The three-day event, inaugurated by Shri J. Raghunath, featured exhibitions, B2B meetings, and a grand fashion show promoting sustainable textile innovations. The IBCCI team, under the leadership of the Secretary General, actively engaged with international participants and Indian industry leaders, exploring avenues for bilateral collaboration. During visits to key industries such as Alliance Fibers Pvt. Ltd. and Takshavi Enterprise, the team gained valuable insights into advanced yarn production, particularly the recycling of PET bottles into RPET yarn, aligning with global sustainability goals. The Expo drew over 24,000 visitors and generated projected business worth ₹1,000 crore. The participation of IBCCI, led by the Secretary General, strengthened cross-border industrial cooperation and underscored the growing partnership between Bangladesh and India in promoting innovation, sustainability, and trade in the textile sector.

7th Act East Business Show 2025 / 25th to 27th March 2025 / Shillong, Meghalaya, India

A five-member delegation from the India-Bangladesh Chamber of Commerce and Industry (IBCCI), led by Secretary General, actively participated in the 7th Act East Business Show 2025, held from 25th to 27th March 2025 at the State Convention Centre, Shillong, Meghalaya, India. The delegation was warmly welcomed by representatives of the Government of Meghalaya and the Indian Chamber of Commerce (ICC) upon arrival. The event, inaugurated by the Honorable Chief Minister of Meghalaya, H. E. Shri Conrad K. Sangma, brought together delegates from 14 nations, including Australia, Bhutan, Germany, Malaysia, Indonesia, the Philippines, Thailand, UAE, and Bangladesh through IBCCI. The Secretary General of IBCCI played a key role throughout the event, greeting the Chief Minister with a crest at the inaugural session, being felicitated by Shri Mahesh Kumar Saharia, Chairman of ICC NER, and serving as a panelist in the session on "Export Promotion from NER." 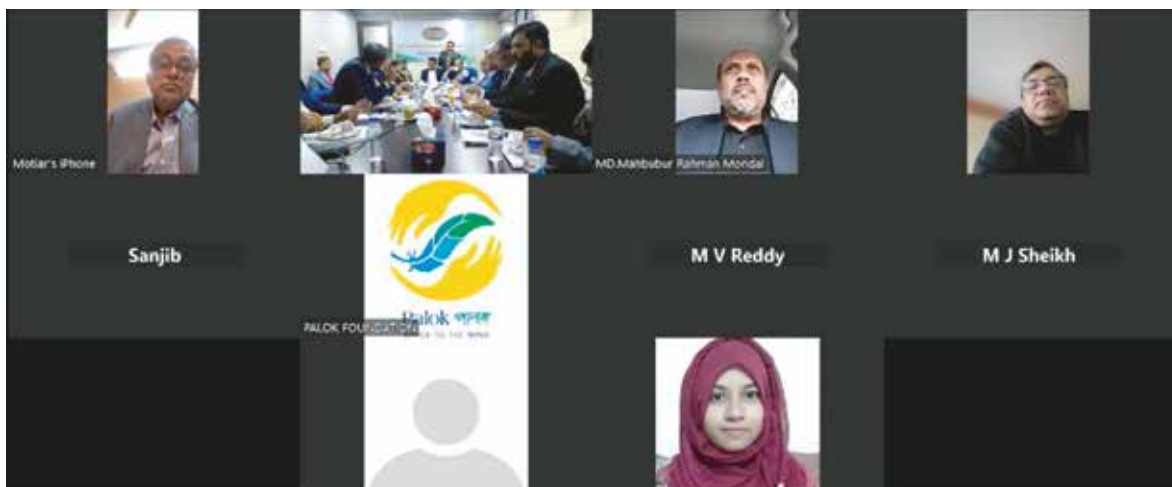

Pre-Budget Discussion for the FY 2025-26 with NBR

A 3-member delegation from IBCCI, led by Honorary Joint Secretary General Mr. Abdul Wahed attended the Pre-Budget Discussion meeting held on 5th March 2025 at the NBR Bhaban, Agargaon, Dhaka. Mr. Abdul Wahed and IBCCI Director Mr. SK Mahfuz Hamid took part in the discussions.



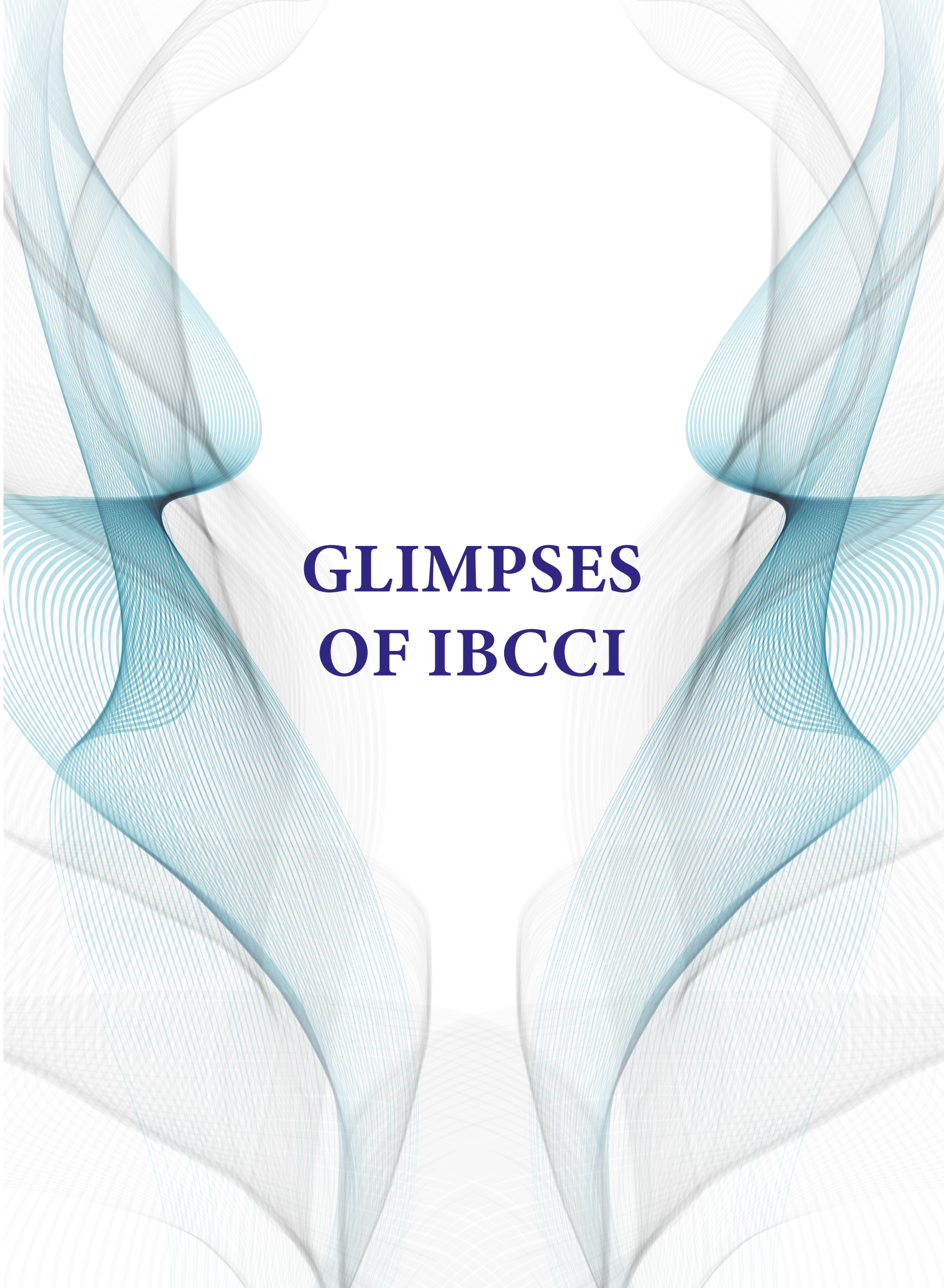

Mr. Abdul Wahed appreciated the comprehensive arrangements of the Pre-Budget meeting for the 2025–2026 National Budget and highlighted key priorities, including ensuring reasonable customs protection for investments, industries, and SMEs; promoting export diversification through exemptions and bond facilities; maintaining stable prices of essential goods; and modernizing the tax system through automation and integration. IBCCI emphasized increasing the tax-GDP ratio by expanding the tax base and compliance, reducing economic inequality, and coordinating customs, tax, and currency management. It also urged quick implementation of the Bangladesh Single Window and AEO expansion, separation of NBR's policy and revenue functions, withdrawal of AIT and AT on industrial inputs, use of ADR to resolve tax disputes, and boosting revenue through transparency, efficiency, and reduced unproductive spending.

On the other hand Director SK Mahfuz Hamid proposed to the NBR that Narayanganj, as the key waterway gateway to Greater Dhaka where most imports are consumed, should be allowed to handle a wider range of importable items. Although the Narayanganj LC Station, now under the nearby full-fledged Customs House, Pangaon, has ample capacity for expansion, the latest SRO-37-law/2022/53 still restricts imports. He urged inclusion of additional items such as industrial machinery, steel, chemicals, fabrics, household goods, vehicles, and cotton to reduce freight costs and boost BIWTA revenue.

Opinion

Notes to the Financial Statement

1 Profile and operational activities of the Organization

1.01 Profile of the Organization

The India -Bangladesh Chamber of Commerce and Industry was incorporated under the Companies Act (# 18) 1994 vide certification of incorporation No. C- 673 on 26th December 2006, as a Company Limited by Guarantee

1.02 Address of the registered and corporate office

The registered and corporate offices of the chamber is located at Rupayan Centre(16th floor) 72 Mohakhali C.A, Dhaka -1212

1.03 Nature of business

The principal activities of the Chamber are as follows:

- a) To encourage two way trade and investment, between the two country's India and Bangladesh.
- b) To encourage co-operation between India and Bangladesh Private/Public sector Companies in third Country. Business operation and to promote friendship, understanding and closer relationship between India and Bangladesh through organizing and support of activities and cooperation on culture, education, economic, commerce, social and sports between the peoples and institutions of India and Bangladesh.
- c) To place joint recommendations to respective governments on improving the environment for mutual trade, commerce, industry fiscal and investment opportunities.
- d) To encourage and develop the establishment of India & Bangladesh Joint Ventures in specific areas of common interest.

1.04 Components of Financial Statement

1. The statement of Financial Position
2. The statement of Comprehensive Income
3. The statement of Receipts & Payments
4. Notes to the Financial Statements with significant accounting policies and other explanatory information

2 Basis of preparation and presentation of the financial statements

2.01 Statements of compliance

The financial statements have been prepared and presented in accordance with the International Financial Reporting Standards (IFRSs), International Accounting Standards (IASs) and the Companies Act (#18)1994, other applicable laws and regulations.

2.02 Basis of measurement

The financial statements have been prepared under historical cost convention on accrual basis other than Statement of Receipts & Payments following going concern assumption under generally accepted accounting principles in Bangladesh.

2.03 Revenue recognition

Revenue recognition is made as per the provisions of IFRS-15 following 5 steps of revenue recognition as follows:

1. identify the contract(s) with a customer
2. identify the performance obligations in the contract. Performance obligations are promises in a contract to transfer to a customer goods or services that are distinct.
3. determine the transaction price
4. allocate the transaction price to each performance obligation on the basis of the relative stand-alone selling prices of each distinct good or service promised in the contract.
5. recognize revenue when a performance obligation is satisfied by transferring a promised good or service to a customer.

2.03.1 Recognition of Subscription and other income:

(i) Subscription & Admission Fees

Subscriptions & Admission Fees are treated as revenue and are recognized when due and invoice is raised accordingly. There are two categories of membership, such as, "Corporate membership" and "Associate Membership". Admission fee for Corporate membership as well as associate Membership fee is Tk. 20,000 and payable only once at the time of their admission. Annual subscription for the Corporate Member is Tk. 20,000 per annum and for Associate Member is Tk. 10,000 per annum. Income is recognized on accrual basis.

(ii) Unsubscribed members

Unsubscribed members (Both Corporates Member and Associate Member) are those who have not paid their annual subscriptions for consecutive two years. Their membership is cancelled for such non payment of subscriptions and removed from the members list and kept separated under the account 'Unsubscribed Members -Corporate or Associate' as the case may be.

(iii) Interest Income

The organization's interest income consists of interest received from Fixed Deposit Receipts (FDR). This income is recognized on a cash basis, upon actual receipt.

(iv) Income from business

According to Section 45 (Kha) of Income Tax Act 2023 Income from business is- " Income derived from any trade or professional association or other association of like nature on account of specific services performed for its members." Such income consists of Advertisement revenue , Registration fee, Letter issued for Visa, Letter issued for Certificate of Origin, Introductory Certificates Issue Other Income is recognized on actual receipt basis.

(v) Other Income

Other incomes of the organization including income from Indo-Bangla Trade Fair (IBTF), Donation Income which are recognized on actual receipt basis.

2.04 Reporting period

The financial period of the organization covers one year from 01 July to 30 June and is followed consistently. This financial statements covers one year from 01 July 2024 to 30 June 2025.

2.05 Use of estimates and judgments

The preparation of financial statement in conformity with IFRSs requires management to make judgments, estimates and assumptions that affect the application of accounting policies and the reported amount of assets, liabilities, income and expenses. Actual results may differ from these estimates. Estimates and underlying assumption are reviewed on ongoing basis. Revisions to accounting estimates are recognized in the period in which the estimate is revised and in any future periods affected. Information about significant areas of estimation, uncertainty and critical judgments in applying accounting policies that have the most significant effect on the amount recognized in the financial statements are stated in the following notes.

Note-03: Depreciation

Note-05: Receivable from Members

Note-10: Liability for expenses

2.06 Property plant and equipment

(i) Recognition and measurement

Tangible fixed assets are capitalized at cost of acquisition and subsequently stated at cost less accumulated depreciation in compliance with the benchmark treatment of IAS 16 Property, Plant and Equipment. The cost of an items of property, plant and equipment comprises its purchase price, import duties and non-refundable taxes, after deducting trade discount and rebates and any cost directly attributable to bringing the assets to the location and condition necessary for it to be capable of operating in the intended manner. Fully depreciated assets are carried in the books of one Taka.

(ii) Depreciation

Depreciation has been charged on a Reducing balance method during the year. Depreciation for addition is charged when assets are ready to use depreciation continues to be provided until such time as the written down value is reduced to Taka one. Depreciation is ceased on the date of disposal/derecognition of the asset.

The rate of depreciation are as follows :

2.08 Functional and presentational currency

These financial statements are presented in Bangladesh Taka (Taka/TK/BDT), which is also the functional currency of the Organization.

2.09 Use of office space extended to the Chamber free of cost by the President of the Chamber

Financial statements do not show any office rent as the office space was extended to the Chamber by the President of the Chamber Mr. Abdul Matlub Ahmad for free use by the Chamber.

2.10 Income Tax

According to SRO-210/Law/Income Tax/2012, dated 01 July 2023, any association of persons or business organizations is subject to tax on their income as outlined below:

- Subscription fees from members are exempted
- Interest income is taxable income
- Income from business is taxable. According to Section 45 (Kha) of Income Tax Act 2023 Income from business is- " Income derived from any trade or professional association or other association of like nature on account of specific services performed for its members."
- Income from other sources is exempted

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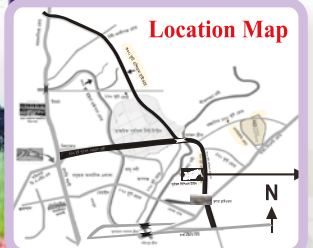
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
